EVALUATION FINDINGS	
Recruitment into ECE Field	Milestone Achievements
64% of high school members expressed interest in remaining in the CDWFI as college students	69% of high school seniors were accepted into college as of mid-April
87% of college members not yet working in ECE planned to enter the field in 3 years	88% of college members completed an education plan
Coursework	11% of college members earned a degree
88% of college-level CD/ECE courses taken by high school members were passed with a C or better	3% of community college members transferred to a four-year university
83% of courses taken by college members this year were passed with a C or better	22% of community college members earned a CD certificate
	15% of college members earned a CD permit
